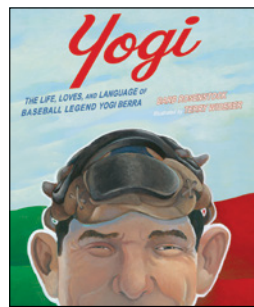
Frank Lloyd Wright becomes America's first world-famous architect in this engaging and inspirational nonfiction picture book introducing organic architecture—a style he created based on the relationship between buildings and the natural world—which transformed the American home.

Frank Lloyd Wright loved the Wisconsin prairie where he was born, with its wide-open sky and waves of tall grass. As his family moved across the United States, young Frank found his own home in shapes: rectangles, triangles, half-moons, and circles. When he returned to his beloved prairie, Frank pursued a career in architecture. But he didn't think the Victorian-era homes found there fit the prairie landscape. Using his knowledge and love of shapes, Frank redesigned the American home inside and out, developing a truly unique architecture style that celebrated the country's landscape and lifestyle. Noted author Barb Rosenstock and artist Christopher Silas Neal explore his early life and creative genius, highlighting his passion, imagination, and ingenuity. The book also includes an author's note, bibliography, source notes, and a gallery of photos of Frank Lloyd Wright's most recognized creations.

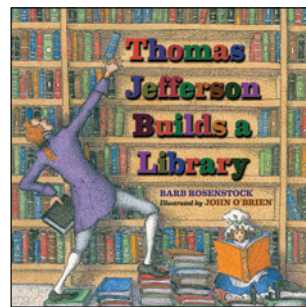

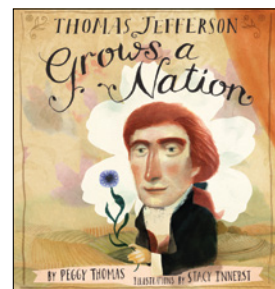
Famous car-maker and businessman Henry Ford loved soybeans. With a mind for ingenuity and a determination that wouldn't quit, Ford built his most inventive car—one completely made of soybeans.

Henry Ford looked to improve life for others. After the Great Depression struck, Ford especially wanted to support ailing farmers. For two years, Ford and his team researched ways to use farmers' crops in his Ford Motor Company. They discovered that the soybean was the perfect answer. Soon, Ford's cars contained many soybean plastic parts, and Ford incorporated soybeans into every part of his life. He ate soybeans, he wore clothes made of soybean fabric, and he wanted to drive soybeans, too. Award-winning author Peggy Thomas and illustrator Edwin Fotheringham explore this American icon's little-known invention. Back matter includes further information on Henry Ford's work with soybeans, a list of the many products that contain soybeans, soybean recipes, a timeline, a bibliography, additional reading, source notes, and archival images.

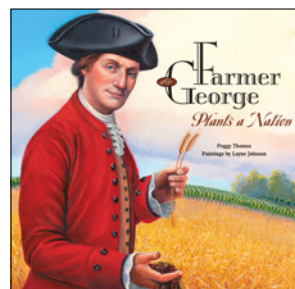

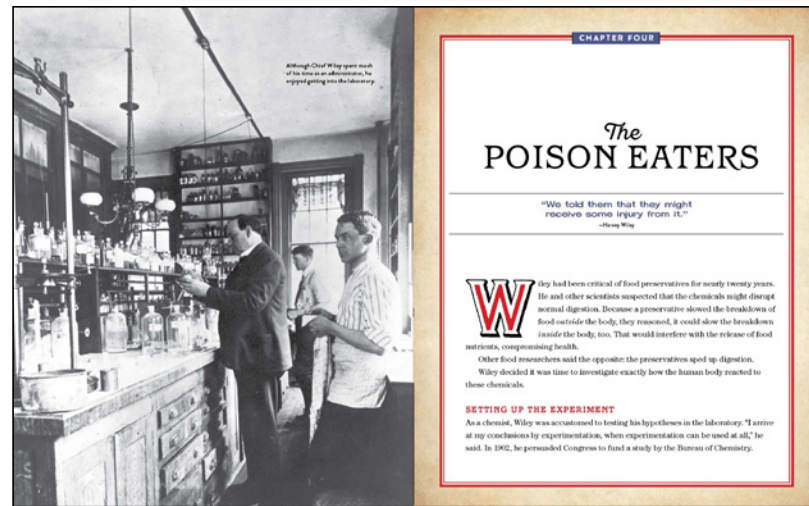

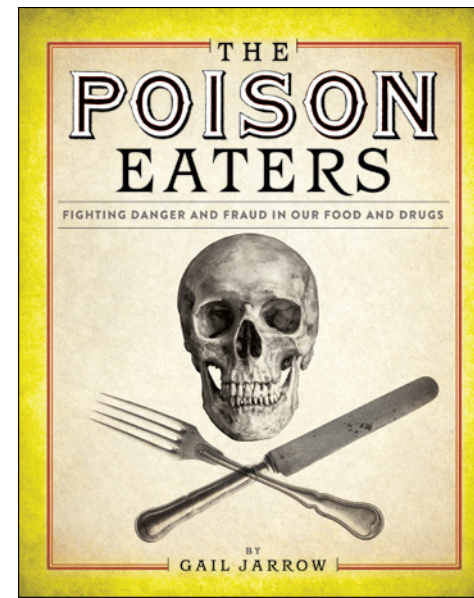

THE POISON EATERS

Fighting Danger and Fraud in our Food and Drugs

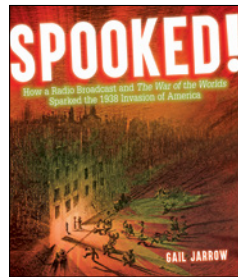

Here is the fascinating true story of how food was made safer to eat thanks to the stubborn dedication of government chemist Dr. Harvey Washington Wiley and his team of poison eaters, whose hard work and determination led to the creation of the Food and Drug Administration.

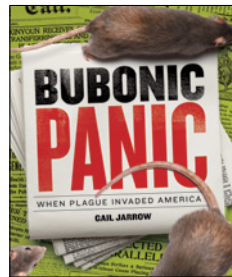
Formaldehyde, borax, salicylic acid. Today, these chemicals are used in embalming fluids, cleaning supplies, and acne medications. But in 1900, they were routinely added to food that Americans ate from cans and jars. Often products weren't safe because unregulated, unethical companies added these and other chemicals to trick consumers into buying spoiled food or harmful medicines. Chemist Harvey Washington Wiley recognized these dangers and began a relentless thirty-year campaign to ensure that consumers could purchase safe food and drugs, eventually leading to the creation of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, or FDA. Acclaimed nonfiction author Gail Jarrow uncovers this intriguing history in her trademark style that makes the past enthrallingly relevant for today's young readers. Thorough source material includes an author's note, glossary, timeline, bibliography, source notes, index, and list of more to explore.

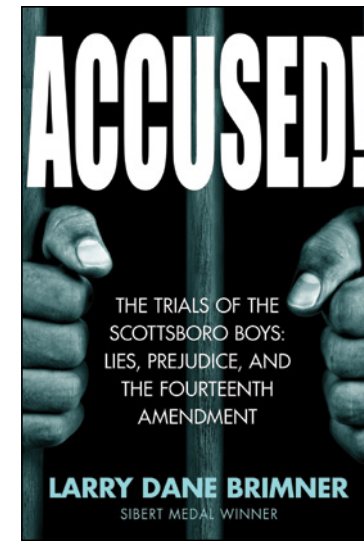

ACCUSED!

The Trials of the Scottsboro Boys: Lies, Prejudice, and the Fourteenth Amendment

Sibert award-winning author Larry Dane Brimmer skillfully relates the harrowing story of the Scottsboro Boys—nine African American teenagers who, when riding the rails during the Great Depression, found their lives destroyed after two white women falsely accused them of rape—and how it took more than eighty years for their wrongful convictions to be overturned.

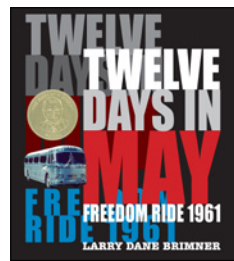
In 1931, nine teenagers—the youngest just thirteen—were arrested as they traveled on a train through Scottsboro, Alabama. All had been hoping to find something better at the end of their journey. But they never arrived. Instead, two white women falsely accused them of rape. The effects were catastrophic for the young men, who came to be known as the Scottsboro Boys. Being accused of raping a white woman in the Jim Crow south almost certainly meant death, either by the electric chair or a lynch mob. The Scottsboro Boys found themselves facing one prejudiced trial after another in one of the worst miscarriages of justice in U.S. history. Noted author Larry Dane Brimmer uncovers how the Scottsboro Boys spent years in Alabama’s prison system, enduring inhumane conditions, racist legal proceedings with all-white juries, and torture. The extensive back matter includes an author’s note, bibliography, further resources and source notes, and index.

LARRY DANE BRIMNER is the recipient of the 2018 Robert F. Sibert Award for the most distinguished informational book for children for his title *Twelve Days in May: Freedom Ride 1961*. He is known for his well-researched, innovative, and award-winning nonfiction for young readers, and is the author of multiple acclaimed civil rights titles. 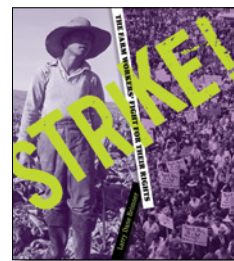

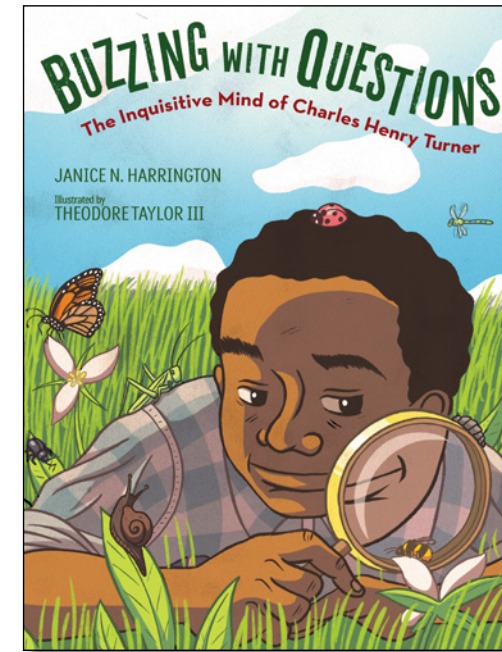

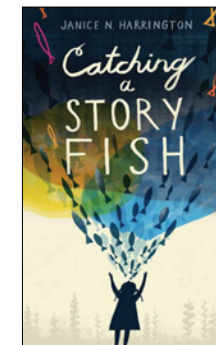
The curiosity of pioneering African American entomologist, Charles Henry Turner—a scientist who studied ants, bees, and other insects—shines in this nonfiction picture book, which showcases his ideas and discoveries.

Charles Henry Turner's mind itched with questions. Fascinated by animals, bugs, and crustaceans, Turner scrutinized their lives. When books didn't answer his questions, he researched, experimented, and looked for answers on his own. Even when faced with racial prejudice, Turner never stopped asking questions or exploring the mysteries of science. Author Janice N. Harrington and artist Theodore Taylor III capture the life of this scientist and educator, highlighting his thirst for knowledge and his passion for insects and biology. The title also includes an author's note, timeline, bibliography, source notes, and archival images.

JANICE N. HARRINGTON is the author of picture books and a novel-in-verse for children, as well as poetry books for adults. Among her honors is a 2007 National Endowment for the Arts Literature Fellowship for Poetry. 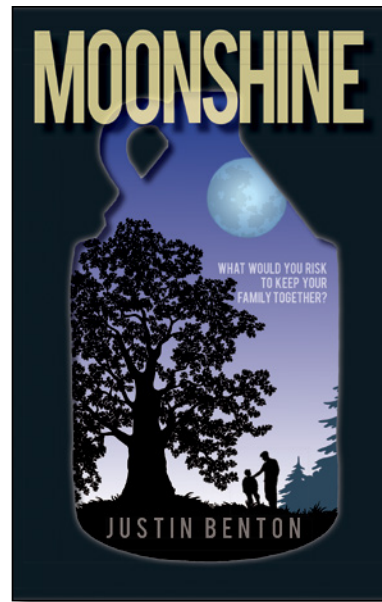

A boy begins to question his and his father's illicit lifestyle brewing moonshine in the Tennessee wilderness and finds himself facing vengeful gangsters, a corrupt sheriff, and worst of all, the possibility of losing his Pa in this coming-of-age historical adventure.

To keep food on the table during the Great Depression, thirteen-year-old Cub helps his widower father illegally distill and sell moonshine, despite Prohibition. However, their relaxed business is interrupted when a gangster named Salvatore arrives and offers a once-in-a-lifetime distribution deal to Cub's father. Eager for a safer lifestyle, Cub decides to interfere with the gangster's negotiations and end the deal. However, this broken arrangement backfires, forcing Cub to make some business decisions before things turn deadly. Cub must race against time to not only save his father's life, but also their future.

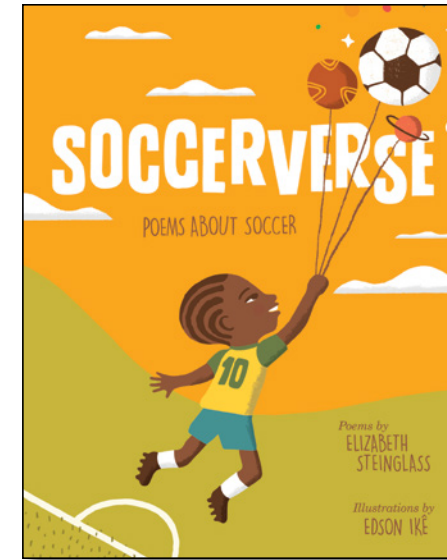

Featuring a diverse cast of girls and boys, the poems in this collection cover winning, losing, teamwork, friendships, skills, good sportsmanship, and, most of all, love for the game. Author Elizabeth Steinglass cleverly incorporates thirteen different poetic forms throughout the book, defining each in a note at the end, and illustrator Edson Ikê's bold artwork is as creative as the poems are surprising.

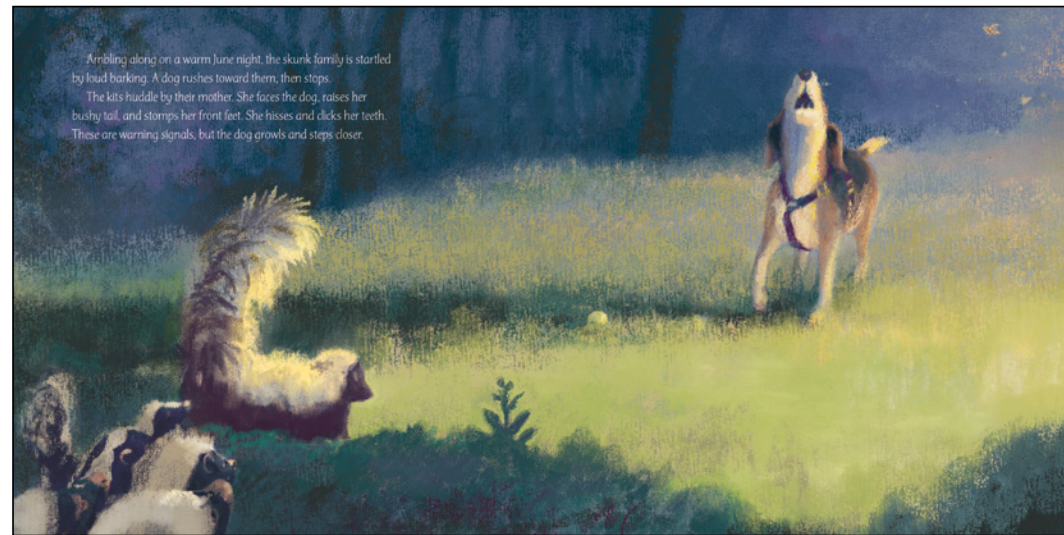
Ten math-loving chicks make a new friend in this exuberant picture book that demonstrates key math concepts to children.

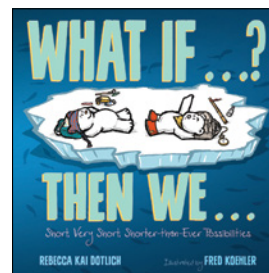
Oliver Wizard overcomes his nighttime fears as his father gently helps him get ready for bed in this picture book that celebrates the power of imagination and of love.
