New Jersey Pizza

The day before I moved to New Jersey, I told my only friend that I was okay with never seeing him again. *Friend* is a pretty generous word to describe us, but I wanted to feel like I was leaving something behind.

I'd always had a knack for burning bridges. This, I believed, was a trait I inherited from my mom, who knows how to get on with life.

But lots of people come and go with little regard for the people they're leaving. My nurses almost never look back. And I can't let that bother me, because (a) most of them don't think two thoughts about me in the first place and (b) I need to keep the revolving door turning to avoid a lapse in my care.

That's not to say my parents aren't capable of taking care of me; I wouldn't have been alive and starting my sophomore year of high school without them. But they can't do it every second of every day, so we hire nurses who are reliable enough to attend school with me and make sure I don't die on their watch.

On the first day in our new house, I sat watching a preseason football game with my brother, Ollie, who was wearing a sweatshirt from the University of Virginia—his future college and the lacrosse team he'd be playing for the following year. He was sitting next to a stack of boxes on the couch we'd dragged across the country.

Our parents walked in, each looking more exhausted than the other. Mom's hands were placed firmly on her hips, which actually wasn't a sign of her being mad. She was about to ask us a question or tell us to do something.

"We're ordering pizza for dinner, okay?" she said. "I'm tired, and there's nothing in the house to cook anyway."

"I hate pizza," I said. "It's gross."

"Too bad, Harris. I'm not running to the grocery store at ten o'clock just to buy you chicken nuggets. You can deal with pizza for one night." She walked away, leaving no opportunity for a rebuttal. To argue with my mom, I had to be faster.

"Dude, we're in New Jersey. Some of the best pizza in the country is right here," Ollie told me.

I ignored him.

Dad lingered behind. "Ollie, can you get up and help a little? Pick up those boxes and bring them into your room?"

"Why didn't the movers unpack everything?"

"It doesn't matter. I asked you to do something."

Ollie dragged his body off the couch, picked up two boxes, and stomped down the hall toward our connecting bedrooms. Dad followed with the rest of the boxes.

I sat alone in an unfamiliar place.

Our house back in San Diego hadn't been big enough for my family, the several nurses who are always coming and going—not to mention the four hundred pounds of metal strapped to my ass. Someone always seemed to be in the way.

The new place seemed pretty good so far. Ollie and I had our own mini wing on the main level. Next to our bedrooms was a huge bathroom with a roll-in shower large enough for me to do donuts in with my wheelchair. Trust me, I'd tried.

You wouldn't believe how difficult it is for real-estate agents to understand what *wheelchair accessible* means. My parents probably spent more time explaining that than driving cross-country. Like, no, the house can't have stairs.

The kitchen filled up with the sounds of my parents arguing and ceramic plates clanking, until it was decided we'd use paper instead. Tensions between everyone were higher than usual. Turned out moving was pretty stressful.

I pulled up to my end of the table, which we'd brought from back home. Thank God

for something familiar. My mom picked up the slice of pizza in front of me and shoved it into my mouth. My disability makes it difficult for me to lift my arms and feed myself. Even small things like a piece of cereal or a plastic spoon pose a challenge. I used to have the muscles to eat independently, but over time I've lost them.

But to be honest, having someone feed you is pretty cool. Despite the occasional mess in my lap from people dropping food, I usually feel like a king being fed by servants. Except those servants are my parents, my brother, or a nurse.

"Are you excited to start at your new schools?" Mom asked.

"We're not five years old," Ollie responded. "We're in high school. No one's excited." I swallowed my first bite of pizza. (I'm a very slow eater.) "I'm pretty excited. New people means no one knows me. I can reinvent myself. Maybe they won't notice my wheelchair."

"They're strangers, not blind," Ollie said.

"Either way, I'm glad we left California. I never want to think about that place again." "Hey, don't be like that," Dad said.

"Be like what?" I asked. "I was miserable there. I had no friends, it was always hot, and it's not like I could go to the beach. Besides, I had at most three good nurses in the last fifteen years."

"What about you, Ollie?" Mom asked, clearly giving up on me. "Your new lacrosse team is way better than the one in San Diego."

"I don't know. Coach introduced me to some of the guys on the team during my tour yesterday. They seemed like jerks."

"Maybe they think you're a jerk," I added.

"Shut up."

"Guys, stop," our mom ordered. "What makes you think they're jerks?"

Ollie shrugged. "None of them would talk to me."

"Why not?"

"Probably because they know I'm better than them. They're pissed off I'm on the team."

"Well, the season doesn't start for a few months. You have time to make friends."

"I don't need to be friends with them. I'm not there to make friends. I'm there to win a championship and then leave for Virginia."

While my brother vented about whether he needed friends to play a team sport, Mom pivoted back to me. "I got a call from the nursing agency here. They have a few people who are interested in going to school with you, Harris."

"Are they young?" I asked.

"I told them you prefer younger nurses. We'll see."

"I prefer young and beautiful, but I'll settle for young."

"You'll settle for what they send," my dad said.

"Yeah, why do they have to be young?" Ollie asked. "They're there to take care of you. You don't have to date them."

Mom raised a cup of water to my mouth. I took a sip from the straw and then another bite of pizza.

"Harris needs a contemporary with him," Mom said. "How would you feel if an old fuck followed you around school all day?"

Ollie shrugged. "Honestly, I wouldn't care." Then he secretly flipped me the finger from across the table.

Our dad rejoined the conversation. "Clare, don't let Harris be too picky. Otherwise you'll end up at school with him every day."

"I don't mind. Harris and I have a great time together, and either way, I'm going with him for the first few days."

The discussion ended with no counterarguments. Of course, it wasn't ideal for my mom to be with me at school, but it wasn't the worst. She was pretty cool for a mom, and not having to worry about a new person following me in a new school was comforting.

After a few bites of New Jersey pizza, I didn't see what all the fuss was about. If that claim to fame was crap, what were the odds Jersey's nurses would be any better?



Chapter 1

"Shut that screen door, Merci! You're letting in mosquitoes!"

Mami's sharp voice makes me jump as Tuerto dashes between my legs. He doesn't even stop for a chin scratch in his race to escape the heat.

It's early, but Mami's already in her scrubs for work, though she's still padding in bedroom slippers and a sloppy ponytail. Her eyebrows aren't drawn in yet, either.

"Sorry. I was just letting him in before he got too loud," I say, swatting at the half

dozen bloodsuckers that are now darting around the kitchen.

The sun was barely up when I heard the meows. They echoed through our backyards, sounding like one of those spirits that Abuela warns about—a tátara-something-or-other buried back in Cuba who gets testy if they think they've been forgotten by their descendants.

Anyway, when I flipped on the light, I found Tuerto glaring at me from outside, his front claws clinging high and wide against the screen like he was the victim of a stickup.

"Did that cat shred the mesh again?" Mami asks, exasperated. "Your father just fixed it last week."

"No." I move my body to hide the new tear near the seam. She's not above making me pay for the repair. But can I help it if our cat is a genius? He's learned to yowl and shake the door to let us know he wants to come in. I've taken videos of him doing that trick because, one, my friend Wilson and I like trading funny cat videos when we're bored, and two, while it may be lousy door manners, we've seen pets on Those Awesome Animals on TV win the \$5,000 prize for less. Maybe we'll get lucky.

"And anyway, you can't blame Tuerto for wanting to come in from the heat, can you? He's wearing a fur coat, you know, and it's his nature to survive." I motion at the thermometer we keep hanging on the patio. The needle is pointing at the red numbers. "It's already ninety degrees!"

It's the best defense I can think of, though I hope she doesn't point out other less flattering parts of Tuerto's nature, namely that he's a heartless murderer. He kills everything: birds, mice, voles, lizards—even baby possums—and leaves them as grisly presents. I think back to the first time Tuerto left us a dead sparrow in Lolo's garden. I was so angry at Tuerto for killing that pretty bird. "We feed Tuerto!" I cried. "He doesn't need to kill things." But Lolo just cradled the little body in his palm and helped me bury it so its spirit could live in the flowers. "There's no stopping Mother Nature in the end, preciosa," he told me, though we tied a silver warning bell to Tuerto's collar after that.

Mami sighs and yanks the chain for the ceiling fan, trying to circulate the airconditioning that never quite keeps up with Florida in July.

"I suppose you're right about the heat," she mutters. Then she reaches under the chipped saltshaker on the kitchen table and hands over today's List of Doom.

I try not to look bitter as I review my list of chores. I should be with Papi and Simón this morning, way out past the cane fields in the Glades. If they finish that job early, they're planning to fish on Lake Okeechobee for a little while.

Mami, however, had other ideas for my time and ruined the fun. She says chores build character.

Which is porquería.

"You have to clean your room today," she tells me, as if I can't read her list myself. "It's a mess. Tuerto is nesting in sweaty underwear."

"It's mostly Roli's," I say. "Go see for yourself—if you dare." It requires the moves of a ninja just to get past our door with Roli's boxes from college all over the room. He hasn't unpacked from when he came home in May.

Naturally, she ignores this. "Let him sleep," she says.

Roli worked the graveyard shift at Walgreens again last night, so he's out cold, snoring como si nada on the other side of the curtain that divides our room.

Mami loads the percolator with El Pico and lights the flame. "You have your summer reading, too. Don't forget. There's only a couple of weeks left before school starts."

From the corner of my eye, I see the incriminating stack of library books sitting on the shelf near the back door exactly where I left them three weeks ago. I read the business book (my free choice) in two days, but I haven't even started the other two, mostly on principle. Why should I do homework for a teacher I haven't even met? 





All it's done so far is give me a headache and make my glasses sit crooked.

No one in this crowd is much for breaking rules, but sweat is already beading above their glossed lips, so maybe they'll be sensible. They're looking to one another, but mostly to Edna Santos.

"Come on, Edna," I say, deciding to go straight to the top. "It's faster, and we're melting out here."

She frowns at me, considering the options. She may be a teacher's pet, but I've seen Edna bend a rule or two. Making faces outside our classroom if she's on a bathroom pass. Changing an answer for a friend when we're self-checking a quiz. How much worse can this be?

I take a step closer. Is she taller than me now? I pull back my shoulders just in case. She looks older somehow than she did in June, when we were in the same class. Maybe it's the blush on her cheeks or the mascara that's making little raccoon circles under her eyes? I try not to stare and just go for the big guns.

"You want to look sweaty in your picture?" I say.

Cha-ching.

In no time, I'm leading the pack of us along the gravel path. We cross the maintenance parking lot, dodging debris. Back here is where Seaward hides the riding mowers and all the other untidy equipment they need to make the campus look like the brochures. INTRODUCTION

One of the most important lessons I learned when I was younger was that being a Black person in this world usually means that at some point, you're going to have to do things you don't enjoy. Even more important was learning that many of those things are going to include white people.

For me, that has meant spending a lot of my time as an adult discussing white supremacy, white privilege, and the negative aspects of whiteness in general.

If you don't know what a bolded word or term means, don't worry: I've defined it at the back of the book. Yes, friends: it's your very own Encyclopedia of Racism.

Anyone who truly knows me would tell you I'd much rather spend my time tweeting about the Lakers, watching rom-coms, or sleeping. But, as I learned a long time ago, there aren't enough people addressing societal issues, so here I am.

Because of how publicly critical I am of the impact white people have, and have had, on people of color and on the general world around them, some people have gone so far as to say I hate white people.

Honestly, this deeply offends me, as I've been to over ten John Mayer concerts and at least two hockey games; there's no way a person who hates white people willingly attends the two whitest events on earth multiple times.

That said, my one actual problem with white people is that many just don't have any sense of accountability when it comes to people of color. Accountability not only for the things white people do that often make interacting with them the most frustrating and tumultuous part of our days. But also, accountability for the historic and current inequities and disparities plaguing Black people and people of color as a whole.

Which is why I've written this book. Not because of the fame, fortune, and chance to

meet Oprah—though those would be pretty dope. But, as a Black person, I speak on behalf of people of color (except those of us on Fox News) when I say: WE HAVE A WHITE PEOPLE PROBLEM.

My aim is to help you go from being a person who is learning and unlearning things about these problems created and perpetuated by white people to someone who actively works to solve them. This is called being an antiracist.

I define antiracists as people who understand that white supremacy isn't something to empathize with Black and brown people over. It's a destructive system and existence that white people created, and antiracists are actively trying to end it.

While many believe there is no way to change the problem, because they believe there is no way to change white people, I disagree. Because after sitting with and talking to many white people throughout my life, I've come to realize that there are white people who do care and who I believe want to make change. But these same white people often don't understand the negative impact they are having or how to be better, because many of them have never had the conversations necessary to know this stuff, either in the classroom or outside of it.

Let's face it: Black people and people of color are taught in school, in the media, and in everyday interactions to be empathetic and understanding of white people and their history. But most white people never have to do the same for us.

You'll notice I don't capitalize the **w** in white when referring to white people, though I capitalize the **B** when referring to Black people. This is a personal preference, because white people are simply defined by the color of their skin, while Black people are a cultural and ethnic group.

For example, I've never met a white person who doesn't know who Christopher Columbus was (even though he didn't discover anything). But most white people can't have an informed conversation about the indigenous people who were already in America and the lingering impact on indigenous people today of so many of their ancestors having been slaughtered by people like Christopher Columbus. Nor do most white people know anything about the white supremacist massacre of Black people in Tulsa, Oklahoma—though most white people can tell you that Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook played together on the Oklahoma City Thunder.

To put it plainly, we have to learn a lot of white crap, including white history, much of which is not even true. Meanwhile, white people never have to learn about us, because doing so would force white people to be held accountable for the many ways they've mistreated—and continue to mistreat—people of color.

This book is an opportunity to change that. To provide some of the context and history that is so often lacking for white people.

Heck, we even added the Encyclopedia of Racism because my white editor pointed out that many of you reading this might not understand some of the terms that I'll be using, some of the events I refer to, or why certain things are racist. I hope you already looked up **white privilege**, from page 00. Here's another opportunity to use the encyclopedia: if you aren't familiar with the 1921 Tulsa Race Massacre, go to the back of the book and learn about it.

But to the point about people who think white people can't change: I understand, and have met those white people, too. These are the types of white people who will say things like "Black people need to get over slavery" or "We had a Black president; there is no more racism." These are people who want white supremacy to continue because it benefits them. They are the same people who will say this book sucks, never having read it.

But this book isn't for those white people. It's for the ones who want to do better, who want to *be* better. But where do white people start? How does someone learn empathy? Is it by watching a specific movie? Listening to an album? I think it starts with understanding.



"Presiding over schoolroom tea. Ernest's train got in just after luncheon. You remember what a beastly lot of fuss there always is."

"Heavens, yes."

They exchanged rueful glances.

"You'd think no child had ever been sent away to school before Mother's boys," Margot said. "Stephen home yet?"

"Not till next week. Is that all your things? Father's got the car this afternoon, so we'd better find a porter to take them up to the house."

"Fancy us with a car!" Margot gave her younger sister a real smile. "Oh look—there's a porter there! I say!"

With the suitcases safely handed over, the sisters set off through the village toward home.

How lovely it was to be back. Each time, the feeling of home surprised her: the clear air, so different from the coal smoke of Durham; the dales above the village and the fields below; the particularly Yorkshire scent of frost and sheep-farming countryside. Home.

The vicarage was a rambling early-Victorian affair. It had been built in the days when vicars were expected to produce eight or nine children for the good of the Empire and—Margot's mother often said—had been bleeding its occupants dry ever since. It was a huge, drafty building, forever in a state of general disrepair. The chimneys smoked, the windows rattled, and it was furnished with a mixture of dilapidated odds and ends left behind by previous vicars and their families. It was always cold, even in the middle of summer. In winter, ice froze in the bedroom jugs and on the windowpanes, and everyone had chilblains despite untold layers of woolen underwear and petticoats. Four children still at home, and the perpetual impossibility of finding servants, on top of her duties as the vicar's wife, meant their mother lived in a state of permanent exhaustion. The garden was a tangled wilderness of fruit trees, chickens, and scraggly vegetables.

The Allen children were accepted eccentrics, bright, bookish, and insular. Their childhood had been one of private games and fierce alliances. Margot had always been the odd one out. While her siblings were angular and awkward and—why not say it?—plain, Margot was something of a beauty. This, in a family that considered humility to be next to godliness, was not always an advantage. Margot was not stupid—none of the Allen children were—but she'd had a reputation as "difficult" from early childhood.

This sense of difference had played out, Margot remembered, as an intense determination for something that was "hers." Toys in the Allen nursery were generally held communally, clothes and other possessions were handed down to younger siblings, and a common front was expected to be presented. Family honor was so important that Margot

had once grumbled that anyone would think they were a duke's children instead of a clergyman's.

To be different was . . . not exactly frowned upon, but definitely considered "up yourself." "She's no better than she ought to be" was one of Nanny's greatest slurs. If a vicarage child did well at something—and they generally were somewhere near the top of their classes—they were expected not to make a fuss of it, to say thank you for any praise, and to politely change the subject. Demurring "Oh, I'm rotten at Latin, really" was considered "affected," but boasting was considered "stuck-up" and was even worse. Margot could still remember bouncing home aged nine, delighted because a stranger in the street had described her as "a most striking child." She had been firmly sat upon by her older brother, Stephen, and told by her father to "Consider the lilies of the field." "The ones that toil not, neither do they spin?" she'd said. "Does that mean I'm excused chores?"

Margot knew she was considered stuck-up. She had been christened Margaret, a name she had always hated, and had changed it to Margot at fourteen, refusing to answer to Margaret until her family had had to admit defeat. She knew Stephen and Jocelyn and even Ruth had always considered her something of an ass. None of them cared about how they looked. But Margot had always loved beautiful things. When the Hendersons at the manor house would bring weekend guests to church, she would sit and stare at their dresses. There was never enough money to go around in the vicarage. Margot had spent her childhood in hand-me-downs from various cousins and homemade creations run up on the Singer sewing machine by Mother.

She had an eye for color and line, and a determination to look good. Even now, after all her troubles, she still kept her hair carefully smoothed back, her eyebrows plucked, her fingernails manicured.

Nowadays, that dissatisfied, out-of-place girl seemed very long ago and far away. Nowadays, Margot wasn't difficult. She wasn't much of anything, really. Sometimes she felt as though all her personality and contrariness had been washed away, leaving something limp and wet-raggish and spinsterish, if you could be such a thing at nineteen.

Or perhaps she had just grown up.

As a child, she had often wondered if she were a foundling, or perhaps swapped at birth. It would be just like her father to take on a villager's child in need of a home. Except, of course, Margot's mother wouldn't be a villager, really—she would be an earl's daughter fleeing disgrace. Meeting her father by chance on her desperate flight, she had been so struck by his goodness, she'd sworn him to secrecy. And now her brothers had all been killed, and the family was coming to find their one true heir . . .

It was a childish enough story, and of course she had known it wasn't really true. She had the look of her grandmother anyway, and the same fair hair as Stephen and Ernest (Jocelyn and Ruth tended more to mouse). But she could still remember the awfulness of feeling so out of favor, so much the odd one out. Margot supposed that her mother loved her. But she had never been entirely sure that she liked her.

At least her mother liked James. Margot was grateful for that every . . . well, every time she reminded herself to be, which was less often than she ought. Her mother loved James. Though how anyone could do anything but love him!

"How's James?" she said abruptly to Jocelyn.

Jocelyn, who had been waiting for this, gave a private grimace.

"He's well. You'll see—we're to join them for nursery tea. He's talking so much more than when you saw him at half term!"

"And he's . . ." Margot knew she was being a dope, but she said it anyway, as she always did. "He's happy?"

"Yes, he's happy." Jocelyn looked at her sister. "He's a very happy child, Margot. Mother and Father treat him just the same as they do Ruth and Ernest. You don't need me to tell you that."

Margot stiffened.

"I do, though, don't I?" she said. "That's the whole problem."



But I see you're smiling.


You're still thinking the Shadowghast is nothing more than a silly superstition. No more than a trick of the light.
