





A masterful portrayal of a country between wars and at war as experienced by the idiosyncratic people the narrator encounters in towns and villages and desolate stretches across the land—from wanderers inside the Chernobyl-irradiated zone, to townspeople terrorized by marauding bears, from travelers on a train skipping stops where hostilities have broken out, to a young couple looking for an apartment in Kyiv before the arrival of their firstborn. Chapeye adds his contemporary voice to the long Eastern European storytelling tradition that includes Chekhov, Gorky, and Babel—showing us people living amidst the normalization of unending war.

ARTEM CHAPEYE has published widely in his native Ukraine, including two novels, four works of nonfiction, and a book of war reportage co-authored with Kateryna Sergatskova. The Ukrainian edition of *The Ukraine* was one of three finalists in the 2018 BBC Book of the Year Awards Nonfiction category. The title story appeared in *The New Yorker* in late March 2022, making him one of the first Ukrainian writers since the start of the war to find a wide readership in the English-speaking world. *The Ukraine* is Chapeye's first book to appear in English.

ZENIA TOMPKINS is an American literary translator and founder of The Tompkins Agency for Ukrainian Literature in Translation (TAULT, tault. org). She has devoted 2023 and 2024 to working exclusively with Ukrainian authors who have enlisted in Ukraine's armed forces since the Russian invasion.



regeant Roger Lamb, a Dublin man, joins the Ninth Regiment of Foot and is promptly sent to America to help curb the colonial uprising. In this fictionalized memoir, renowned poet and novelist Robert Graves liberates his British infantryman from the footnotes of history and brings him to life as a man far from home, fighting for the crown on the losing side of what will become the American Revolution. And Lamb's voice refuses to be marginal: his opinions on life in the New World, his experiences of battle and naval engagements, his passions and frustrations all come together in Graves's picaresque portrait of a soldier and his time. Sergeant Lamb's America, the first of the author's two Sergeant Lamb novels, begins with Lamb's early days in Dublin and ends with his arrival in Boston as a member of the regiment taken prisoner following General Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga.

Poet, translator, and novelist, **ROBERT GRAVES** (1895–1985) was one of the leading English men of letters of the first half of the twentieth century. He served in World War I—an experience recounted in his sublime autobiography *Good-Bye to All That*. His novels about the Roman emperor Claudius include *I, Claudius*, and his works on mythology include *The White Goddess. Sergeant Lamb's America* and *Proceed Sergeant Lamb* are his only two books set in the United States.

MADISON SMARTT BELL's novel *All Souls' Rising* was a finalist for the 1995 National Book Award and is the first in his acclaimed trilogy about the Haitian Revolution. In addition to his dozen other novels and works of biography and general nonfiction, Madison is a professor of English at Goucher College.

ROSA LUXEMBURG was a leader of the German Social Democratic Federation and jailed for her opposition to World War I. She was assassinated in 1919.


ERNESTO CHE GUEVARA was born in Argentina and became a central leader of the Cuban Revolution. He was apprehended while waging a war of liberation in Bolivia, and summarily executed, in 1967.

ADRIENNE RICH (1929-2012) was one of America's greatest and most radical poets.



Lucija opens her eyes to find that she is in a hospital, paralyzed and incapable of speech. Though she is immobile, her mind reels, memories of the past a salve and a burden. She sifts through her life: a family split apart by the Croatian War of Independence, a difficult and overbearing mother, a strained relationship with a lover who struggles to feel at home in his own body. Lucija's mother and lover—the other two narrators in the novel—aren't trapped in the hospital like Lucija, but they too experience other forms of "locked-in syndrome" created by the conservatism that pervades Croatian society. Here is a story of a hidden relationship, the effects of a near-fatal accident, and three lives lived in resistance to oppressive confinement.

IVANA BODROŽIĆ was born in Vukovar, Croatia, in 1982, where she lived until the Yugoslav Wars started in 1991. Her first novel, *The Hotel Tito* (Seven Stories, 2017) was a bestseller in Croatia, where it won three major awards. The French edition won the Prix Ulysse for Best Debut Novel. This was followed by *We Trade Our Night for Someone Else's Day* (Seven Stories, 2021), her second novel to appear in English and her first political thriller.

ELLEN ELIAS-BURSAĆ translates fiction and nonfiction from Bosnian, Croatian, and Serbian. She has taught in the Harvard University Slavic Department and is a contributing editor to *Asymptote*. She has translated both of Ivana Bodrožić's previous books for Seven Stories in addition to Robert Perisic's novel *No-Signal Area*. She lives in Boston.

As we approach the 100th anniversary of Victor Serge's classic exposé of political repression, the specter of fear as a tool is once again chillingly familiar. An anarchist, Bolshevik, and Communist revolutionary journalist, a historian and memoirist who experienced firsthand the upheavals of a succession of post-revolutionary Soviet regimes, Serge wrote this manual so that other revolutionaries could understand the habits and structures of state repression and figure out how to use them on behalf of the common good.

VICTOR SERGE was born to Russian émigré parents in Belgium in 1890. At an early age, he became active in revolutionary activities, and he was imprisoned for five years in France. On his release he returned to revolutionary Russia where he threw himself into the defense of the fledgling government. After Lenin's death he became increasingly alienated from Stalin's clique and was expelled from the Soviet Union in 1936 for speaking out against the purges. He died in exile in Mexico in 1947. He wrote numerous books, including *Memoirs of a Revolutionary*.

ANTHONY ARNOVE is the editor of several books including, most recently, with Haley Pessin, *Voices of a People's History of the United States in the 21st Century.* Arnove co-founded Voices of a People's History of the United States, and is the director of the Roam Agency.



ERNESTO GUEVARA DE LA SERNA was


born in Rosario, Argentina, on June 14, 1928. During his medical studies in Buenos Aires, he took a trip with his friend Alberto Granado on an old Norton motorcycle through all of Latin America, the basis for *The Motorcycle Diaries*. In 1954, he became involved in political activity in Guatemala and was an eyewitness to the CIA-organized military overthrow of the elected government. In Mexico City, Che linked up with exiled Cuban revolutionaries and met Fidel Castro in 1955. He would go on to become the Rebel Army commander, a key leader of the new revolutionary government, and the central leader of what would become the Communist Party of Cuba.

A world-renowned scholar specializing in the works of Ernesto Che Guevara, MARÍA DEL CARMEN ARIET GARCÍA played a leading role in the research that led to the discovery of Che's remains in Bolivia in 1997. She now coordinates the work of the Che Guevara Studies Center in Havana.

Born in 1966 in Ghulja in the Xinjiang region, **GULBAHAR HAITIWAJI** was an executive in the Chinese oil industry before leaving for France in 2006 with her husband and children, who obtained the status of political refugees. In 2017 she was summoned to China for an administrative issue, arrested, and sent to a "reeducation" camp for three years. Thanks to the efforts of her family and the French Foreign Ministry, she was freed and was able to return to France, where she currently resides.

ROZENN MORGAT is a journalist at *Le Figaro* and a specialist reporting on the Uyghurs. Working directly with Haitiwaji, she gathered together her account of her experiences in Xinjiang, and together they turned Haitiwaji's story into this book.


Sergeant Roger Lamb is in a prison camp near Boston, along with some 3,000 other soldiers of General John Burgoyne's army who surrendered at the Battle of Saratoga. When the American Congress refuses to ratify a repatriation agreement, soldiers begin defecting and Lamb plans an escape. He manages to make his way through General Washington's lines and rejoins Cornwallis in the Carolinas, fighting with him until Yorktown in a great test of national and personal loyalties. The second in a two-book series, this account is inspired by the reallife Sergeant Lamb's personal memoirs. Graves traces the sergeant's harrowing time in military service, providing a compelling, only barely fictionalized account of a turning point in American history.

Poet, translator, and novelist, **ROBERT GRAVES** (1895–1985) was one of the leading English men of letters of the first half of the twentieth century. He served in World War I—an experience recounted in his sublime autobiography *Good-Bye to All That*. He is the author of *I, Claudius*, and his works on mythology include *The White Goddess*. The Lamb novels are his only two books set in the United States.

MADISON SMARTT BELL's novel *All Souls' Rising* was a finalist for the 1995 National Book Award and is the first in his acclaimed trilogy about the Haitian Revolution. In addition to his dozen other novels and works of biography and general nonfiction, Madison is a professor of English at Goucher College.

I Can Give You Anything But Love

GARY INDIANA

Based on the author's experiences as a social services worker in San Francisco in the 1980s and 1990s, *Out of the Rain* captures the raw pulse of life on the edge as lived by combat veterans, substance abusers, unemployed and underemployed people, all of whom know the real stakes of housing insecurity, drug addiction, and life on the street.







ODILE HELLIER was born in the South of France during World War II and raised near the German border and in Brittany. She was the founder and owner of the Village Voice Bookshop—a hub of Anglophone literary life and culture that operated in the heart of Saint-Germaindes-Prés in Paris for over thirty years.

CHARLES KENNET "C. K." WILLIAMS was an American poet, critic, and translator. His book Flesh and Blood won the National Book Critics Circle Award in 1987 and Repair won the 2000 Pulitzer Prize for Poetry and the Los Angeles Times Book Prize.

His novel *Night People* was awarded the Italian Premio Brancati, established by Pier Paolo Pasolini and Alberto Moravia, and he has been the recipient of awards from the National Endowment for the Arts, the American Library Association, the Writers Guild of America, and the Christopher Isherwood Foundation. He lives in the San Francisco Bay Area.



Martí was an outstanding teacher, journalist, poet, and revolutionary of his time, able to interweave the threads of Latin American culture and history. His writing is an augur of what would come to pass.

JOSÉ MARTÍ (1853–1895), Cuban poet and essayist, patriot and martyr, became the symbol of Cuba's struggle for independence from Spain. His dedication to the goal of Cuban freedom made his name a synonym for liberty throughout Latin America. As a patriot, Martí organized, unified, and died for the movement for Cuban independence. As a writer, he was distinguished for his personal prose and deceptively simple, sincere verse on themes of a free and united America.



Born in Argentina in 1922, **ALBERTO GRANADO** was Che's companion on his first motorcycle adventure in Latin America, chronicled in the *New York Times* bestseller *The Motorcycle Diaries*. Granado co-founded the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Santiago and authored the memoir *Traveling with Che Guevara: The Making of a Revolutionary*. He retired in 1994.

An Irish-American family comes to life in this first novel by actor and independent filmmaker Edward Burns. The book opens at a wake, as our twelve-year-old narrator, an aspiring writer, takes in the death of his beloved grandfather, Pop, a larger-than-life figure to him. The overflowing crowd includes sandhogs in their muddy work boots, old Irish biddies in black dresses and cops in uniform, along with the family in mourning. There's an open casket, the first time he's seen a dead person. Later, at the bar across the street, he tells a story to the assembled crowd about the day his dad proposed to his mom, and how he almost got beat up by her brothers for it, and then how Pop made him propose twice.

His mom calls him "Kneenie," and with her husband and older son Tommy lost to her, he's the best thing she's got. He sees her struggling, but doesn't know how to help—since like his brother and father before him he knows he'll also abandon her soon enough.

Stories cascade between the prior generation's colorful origins in the Bronx and the softer world of Gibson, the Long Island town where the family lives now. There are scenes in the Rockaways, at Belmont Race Track, and in Montauk. Out of individual struggles a collective warmth emerges, a certain kind of American story, raucous and joyous.

Born in Woodside, Queens and raised on Long Island, **EDWARD BURNS** has made fourteen feature films as a writer-director-actor and starred in many films, including *Saving Private Ryan*. Burns' first film *The Brothers McMullen*, premiered in competition at the 1995 Sundance Film Festival, winning the Grand Jury prize. The film also won "Best First Feature" at the 1996 Independent Spirit Awards. In 2015, he published *Independent Ed*, an inside look at his two decades as a pioneer in independent filmmaking. *A Kid from Marlboro Road* is his first novel, based on his childhood memories and the Irish American communities of the Bronx and Long Island. 

The Use of Photography

Dove and death cohabit in *The Use of Photography*. First published in France in 2005, the book recounts a passionate love affair between Ernaux and the journalist and author Marc Marie, after the two met in January 2003. Ernaux was receiving intensive chemo for breast cancer, and had lost all her hair from the treatments. She had surgery, followed by radiation therapy. Ernaux describes how, shortly after the affair began, she found herself entranced each morning by the sight of clothes strewn about, chairs out of place, and the remains of their last meal of the evening still on the table—and how painful it felt to put things back in order afterward. She went and got her camera, and began to take photographs of the scenes of disarray. When she told Marc Marie what she had done, he said he had felt the same desire.

The Use of Photography is one of the quintessential Ernaux books, told primarily through words in Ernaux's inimitable style, which is adopted here by both authors, and with their photographs adding another lens through which to capture the story.

Winner of the Nobel Prize for literature in 2022, **ANNIE ERNAUX** is considered one of Europe's most important contemporary writers. She has expanded the very meaning of literature and has asserted her feminism and class consciousness in the stories she tells.



Often, from the start of our relationship, on waking I would gaze in fascination at the dinner table, which had not been cleared, at the chairs out of place, our tangled clothes that had been thrown all over the floor the night before, while we were making love. It was a different landscape every time. Having to destroy it by separating and picking up each of our belongings made my heart heavy. I felt as if I were removing the only objective trace of our pleasure

One morning, I got up after M. had left. Celebrated historian and children's book author, William Loren Katz offers a thoroughly researched look at the lives of enslaved people in the United States in *Breaking the Chains*. From their African abductions through their brave resistance to and escape from the ships and harsh plantation life to their roles in the Civil War, those given voice here show that enslaved people themselves were a driving force behind their emancipation.

WILLIAM LOREN KATZ (1927–2019) was born in Brooklyn and grew up in Greenwich Village in a progressive family dedicated to social justice. After serving in WWII and attending college on the GI Bill, he became a teacher in New York for many years. The author of more than 40 books, many for younger readers, he documented the often overlooked contributions of black and indigenous people through history. Through his scholarship and educational outreach, he helped to refashion social studies curriculums across the country, encouraging the histories of minorities and women to be part of American history courses rather than siloed into their own fields of study.

ROBIN D. G. KELLEY is an American historian and academic, currently teaching at the University of California, Los Angeles. He is the author of several books, including Freedom Dreams: The Black Radical Imagination and Hammer and Hoe: Alabama Communists During the Great Depression.





ocrates: A Life Worth Living traces the life and thought of Western civilization's founding philosopher, the thinker whose influence is still felt more than two thousand years later. By using the framework of a biography, and showing us the childhood, adolescence, and daily rhythms of the ancient Athenian, Lehmann reveals an important part of the Socratic method—its place in everyday, real life. Socrates's most important contribution to philosophy was the example he set. He challenged the people around him to test their ideas and beliefs in conversation with one other, with the conviction that this is how we become a better society, one that differentiates between truth and falsehood and discovers together what makes a life worthwhile. Socrates did not claim to have definitive answers, but he knew that the pursuit of knowledge is the key to a good life, and he invited everyone he met to join him in his quest.

DEVRA LEHMANN's *Spinoza* was the winner of the 2014 National Jewish Book Award for Children's and Young Adult Literature and was named a *Kirkus* Best Teen Book of 2014. In 2022, *Spinoza* was named a *Kirkus* Best Teen & YA Nonfiction. In her thirty-five years in the classroom, she has taught preschoolers to sound out monosyllables, high schoolers to read Shakespeare, and adults to parse Talmudic passages. She is now at work on a young adult biography of Augustine of Hippo.





Then he was twenty-three, Bento Spinoza formally Baruch and later Benedict de Spinozawas cast out of his Amsterdam Jewish community, cursed, and effectively erased from their communal life. 



The young Martinican poet and his friends Léopold Sédar Senghor and Léon-Gontran Damas are launching the Negritude movement. Together, they celebrate their Black African roots, protesting French colonial rule and policies of assimilation. They invite West Indians, Senegalese, Guyanese, and others to reject the suffocating French colonial presence and to take pride in their accents, their cultures, and their shared histories. Césaire's great book-length poem, Notebook of a Return to the Native Land, and his other works, are a global inspiration. His speeches enliven the crowds back home in Martinique, and he rises in the political arena, defending Martinican identity and fighting against colonial power and for the dignity of Black people everywhere.

Born in 1959 in Chad, **NIMROD** is a poet, philosopher, novelist, essayist, and journalist. He has received the Vocation Prize, the Louis Labé Prize and the Thyde Monniere Grant and the Société des Gens de Lettres, and is the author of several novels and an essay collection in French.



Corczak was the pen name of Polish doctor, Henry Goldszmit, an author of books for and about children, and, most famously, the director of a Warsaw orphanage which he called a "republic of children," where their rights, their voices, fairness and respect were paramount. Though some were very young, the children had a parliament, a newspaper, and a court. They learned citizen participation and communal responsibility. When the Nazis invaded Poland, Korczak was given the opportunity by the authorities to escape before his children were sent to the camps but he refused to abandon those in his care.

ISABELLE COLLOMBAT is a journalist by training. She tells the story of today's world through documentaries and novels for young people, including the documentary album *Heroes for the Earth* and historical novels in the collection *Chico Mendes: No to Deforestation*, and *Rachel Carson: No to the Destruction of Nature*.

In this fictionalized biography of the great activist and revolutionary, we see Rosa Luxemburg's actions and ideas through the eyes of her faithful companion, Mimi, an alley cat who has a front row view of this astonishing thinker and mover who railed against building walls between countries and people.

Luxemburg was a Polish-born German revolutionary emboldened by the necessity of acting against imperialism, colonialism, and militarism. When she was jailed in 1914 for her anti-war speeches, she continued to speak against World War I and wrote pamphlets under a pseudonym. After her release from prison she continued campaigning and co-founded the Communist Party of Germany. Luxemburg was assassinated by the German Freikorps, who were sent by the German Chancellor to destroy the left-wing revolt. On the night before her death, she wrote about her belief in the masses and the "inevitability of a triumphant revolution." Her writings and commitment to democracy and internationalism live on.

ANNE BLANCHARD is the author of L'encyclopédie des rebelles, insoumis et autres révolutionnaires (Encyclopedia of Rebels and Other Revolutionaries) and of L'encyclopédie des héros, icônes et autres demi-dieux (The Encyclopedia of Heroes, Icons and Other Demigods) (Gallimard Jeunesse). She has a special fondness for Rosa Luxemburg, a woman who put her whole life at the service of a cause she thought was just.








An Unexpected Light






JOSÉ DE SOUSA SARAMAGO (November 1922–June 2010) was a Portuguese writer and recipient of the 1998 Nobel Prize in Literature. His international breakthrough came with the novel *Baltasar and Blimunda*, published in 1982. Saramago was an atheist and a member of the Portuguese Communist Party. His writings, which often employ allegorical renderings of historical events, were controversial in his native country. Saramago's work has been translated into over 25 languages and he remains one of the most important writers of the past century.
