

With a hefty dollop of humor, Atinuke's rollicking counting story takes on a life of its own when Granny's mischievous goats start escaping.



Sean E Avery


Summary

A spellbinding story about a little girl, the sea, and a seemingly fierce creature in need of her help.


My toes hunt for grooves in the rough rock. And then . . . I see her.

Summary

A mayfly newly born in the city gives meaning to "seize the day" in this lyrical, stunningly illustrated story at once poignant and uplifting.

One early spring day, Mayfly emerges from a lake in the middle of the city, looks around, lifts her wings nervously, and takes flight. Nobody notices, except for a little girl in a yellow raincoat, following close behind. Mayfly has been given just one day—her birthday!—but she intends to live life to the fullest, with the wind beneath her wings. Richard Jones


Summary

Tim Hopgood


Summary


Spare, layered text and soft, shimmering watercolor illustrations reveal how curiosity—and a change in perspective—can light up the world and forge surprising friendships.


"I'm Cora," I say. "Don't be afraid. You aren't lost anymore. You're found."




A father and daughter go out to surf at dawn in this touching, visually striking ode to the bond between parent and child.

In her first picture book, a renowned novelist weaves a gentle environmental message into a lyrical ode to family life at the seaside through the changing seasons.




Summary
